**ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

King David confesses, “I have sinned against the Lord”—the sins of adultery, murder, deception, infidelity. The Pharisee in the Gospel expects Jesus to be repulsed by any person who approached him dripping in sin. But before the contrite and sorrowful sinner, Christ’s response is just the opposite; he offers forgiveness. Why? Because, once forgiven, the former great sinner “will love him more.” The sinful woman refuses to let the fact of her sin be the horizon of her life. Christ is there. She goes to him, interrupts the dinner, bathes his feet, weeps. And the Lord acts as if he has always been waiting for her...waiting for all who “live by faith in the Son of God. . . .

**TODAYS READINGS (Year C)**

**First Reading:** Nathan, the prophet, publicly denounces David’s sin, and prescribes for David’s household the punishment he himself decreed in an analogous case. David’s sin, committed in the dark for none to see, was exposed to all in the light of day. The depth and breadth of David’s sin was met by the depth and breadth of God’s desire to be merciful. Nathan proclaims God’s forgiveness of David, whose life was spared and whose descendants would receive a Savior to rescue them from the punishment due to sin.

**Responsorial Psalm:** In response to God’s forgiveness of David’s sin, the Church proclaims Psalm 32, which celebrates the joy experienced by the forgiven. We surrender our sinful lives to the Lord, who already knows our sin and desires to shower us with mercy.

**Second Reading:** Paul proclaims that the cross of Christ accomplishes in the life of believers what attempts at fidelity to the Law of Moses could never accomplish. Believers are made righteous before God, by the self-emptying death of Christ. In surrendering our lives to Christ and uniting them to his sacrifice on the cross, we place our trust not in ourselves but in his love for us.

**Gospel:** Jesus tells a parable to the Pharisees so that the life of a forgiven woman would be a parable for us all. The Pharisees’ insight that the person who was forgiven more will love the one who forgives more, is taken up by Jesus in announcing the forgiveness of the woman’s sin. Her act of generous love toward Jesus in washing his feet with her tears and drying them with her hair indicates that she has already known in Jesus what he announces—forgiveness. Jesus has forgiven our sins by his death on the cross. What does that forgiveness invite us to today?
