**THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

The last Sundays in Ordinary Time lead us into deeper reflection on the end of all time and the Second Coming of Christ. The readings this Sunday and next Sunday, the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, focus on this event, as does the Gospel reading of the following Sunday, thus creating a seamless transition to the new season of Advent.

**TODAYS READINGS (Year C)**

**First Reading:** Malachi announces a final and definitive day of judgment. The one same reality will result in the annihilation of evil and the eternal glory of the just. Malachi's prophecy demands that we take stock of our lives as we presently stand before the Lord and engage faith's challenge so that we will one day be taken up in glory.

**Responsorial Psalm:** In Psalm 97 the Church announces her faith in a future judgment through which God's rule will be firmly established. .

**Second Reading:** Although Paul would have been within his rights to receive the hospitality of the Thessalonians without engaging in labor, he chose not to exercise that right so that he might witness to apostolic zeal for God's kingdom. We, too, are often invited to forgo what may rightfully belong to us to serve the needs of others. In this we follow Paul in his imitation of Christ.

**Gospel:** Jesus proclaims that the end times are not an occasion for fear but for witness. Jesus' followers are invited to trust that trials and suffering are opportunities to witness to the faith; a witness that does not point to the human capacity for forbearance, but to God's power to save us from death itself.

**FEAST/MEMORIAL MASSES THIS WEEK**

**Monday, November 15. Optional memorial of Saint Albert the Great (+1280), bishop, doctor of the Church.** Saint Albert the Great was a Dominican friar, famous for his comprehensive knowledge and advocacy of coexistence of science and religion. He was born in Bavaria, educated at Padua, and in 1254 was sent by the Dominicans to Paris, where he earned a doctorate and taught theology. Among his students at Paris was Saint Thomas Aquinas. In 1260 he was made Bishop of Regensburg but resigned after three years. Albert wrote on subjects as varied as logic, geography, and chemistry based on his observations and logic. He was called "Albert the Great" during his lifetime by Roger Bacon.

**Tuesday, November 16. Optional memorial of Saint Margaret of Scotland (+1093) and Saint Gertrude (+1301), virgin.** Saint Margaret was the wife of Malcolm III, King of the Scots, with whom she had eight children. She personally cared for orphans and the poor, feeding them before she fed herself.

Saint Gertrude, also called "Gertrude the Great," was a German Benedictine and mystical writer. Born in Thuringia, she joined a Benedictine monastery in Helfta, studied, and became adept at literature and philosophy. Her mystical experiences are described in the *Revelations of St. Gertrude the Great*. Among her revelations are the seeds of what developed into devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

**Wednesday, November 17, Memorial, Saint Elizabeth of Hungary (+1231), religious.** Saint Elizabeth was born in Hungary. At the age of 14 she married Ludwig of Thuringia, but her life changed when he died of the plague en route to join the Sixth Crusade. She was only 20, and on hearing the news is supposed to have said, "He is dead. He is dead. It is to me as if the whole world died today." Ludwig's family wanted to arrange a political marriage for her, but Elizabeth took vow of chastity and dedicated the rest of her life to prayer. She became a Third Order Franciscan and died at the age of 24.

**Thursday, November 18. Optional memorials of Dedication of the Basilicas of Saint Peter and Saint Paul in Rome, apostles; Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne (+1852) virgin.** Saint Peter's is built on a site chosen by Constantine in 319; the basilica, as we know it today, was built in 1506 by Julius II. Saint Paul Outside the Walls is built on the site where Paul is believed to have been beheaded.

Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne was born in Grenoble, France, and founded the Society of the Sacred Heart with Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat. She started the first houses in the United States. At the end of her life she went to help with the mission to the Potawatomi. Her long hours of prayer caused the Indians to name her *Quah-kah-ka-num-ad*, "Woman-Who-Prays-Always." (Sourcebook).
